From the study:

THE POWER OF THE RESURRECTION FOR US

The resurrection of Christ is an objective fact of history. But it is far more than that. It is also a spiritual truth that brings life, vitality and power to our Christian lives. Christ's victory over the grave, his victory over death is a testimony to us of the extent of his power at work in our lives. If he has defeated this foe then he can defeat any foe. If he has overcome what seemed to be an insurmountable mountain, then what is there that is truly still insurmountable?

Tim Keller has this to say:

There is no way to understand how the world was so changed by the Christian message if it was just a philosophy. It was a proclamation that something happened.

That's the reason why Paul is able to actually taunt at death. Why? Because he says in the beginning of Romans 1:4, 'God declared him to be the Son of God with power by the resurrection.' Paul didn't understand he was the Son of God till he saw him raised, and he began to realize what Jesus has done. There is hope why? Because this is the Son of God. Death could not hold him down.

It says in Acts 2, when the first sermon was preached by Peter, 'He rose from the dead because death could not hold him.' It was impossible for death to hold him. Think about the power of death for a minute. Think about it. Nothing can stop death. No human being can stop death. The power of decay. The second law of thermodynamics. Even mountains can't stop death. The mountains eventually get worn down to pebbles. Even the sun and the stars can't stop death. Even they burn out and go to decay. Think of the power of death.

Yet someone came who overmatched death. Jesus Christ was swallowed by death and exploded in its bowels. Jesus Christ did not just defy death. He did not just deny death. He destroyed death. That's the reason why Paul can say later on in this chapter, 'O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory?' Only Christians have this unbelievable ability to handle worry and handle anxiety. Why? Because they can look at the most powerful obstacle to happiness in the universe, death itself, and actually taunt it.¹

Worry and anxiety, fear and foreboding, hopelessness and desperation, temptation and trial – none of these are more formidable or greater than death. And if death has been defeated in Christ, how much more will he not also lead us into victory in these areas.

If the worst thing that can happen to you is that you die and go home to be with your saviour forever then you have nothing to fear. Take courage in the power of the resurrection that is in you.



An important message about church finances

We would like to address an urgent matter with the congregation. As the majority of the members do not feel it is necessary to attend Church Meetings (less than 25 at the most recent 25th March 2018 meeting), the Meeting has asked us to make the church aware of our financial situation.

Our position as at 28th February was as follows:

Income (July 2017 – Feb 2018)	R 490262
Expenditure (July 2017 – Feb 2018)	R 499462
Deficit	R 9200

At the AGM we undertook to donate R7200 to each of five different persons / organisations (a total of R36000). At the end of February, we did not have these funds available to make these payments. The current account balance as of the end of February 2018 is only **R16870**.

The church meeting took the following decisions:

1. The church should be informed of the situation via article in The Challenge (this article).
2. The Elders would address this issue in the church services over the next few weeks.
3. The church would invite a visiting preach to speak on tithing and giving. Rev. Dave Howard will be coming on the 15th April 2018 (Grant to do a pulpit swap with Dave).
4. The treasurer will **not** make the annual donations (R36000) payments until we have reviewed our financial situation at the 27th May 2018 Church Members meeting.
5. A special offering would be taken on the 50th Anniversary service of the church building on the 6th May 2018. This would be used towards the payment of the annual donations (R36000).
6. The church meeting expressed the necessity of every church member taking responsibility for the financial situation of our church. It is not the treasurer's or minister's responsibility. It is our responsibility as a church.

Finally, we would also ask that, in order to balance the books at month end, it would be appreciated that tithes paid by EFT could be made by the end of the month.

At the same time, we are attempting to keep the expenses to a minimum.

Recognizing the god of Me

The foundation of reality is that there is one God, and you are not Him. Once that's established, a choice must be made, and here it is:

I know that there is the Lord God, the master of all creation. I also know there's the god of me, the pretender to the throne. Whom will I serve?

In my brokenness, I feel the pull to worship me. I hear the whispered lie that Adam and Eve first heard: "Your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God" (Gen. 3:5). Why serve? You rule! You have everything you need to be your own god. Every day is a trip to that orchard; every day the snake is waiting. I must face this same choice: Will I worship God, and find my true place in this universe, the perfect place he has arranged for me? Or will I worship me and decide I can somehow come up with a better life than the Creator of all could design?

You'll confront many of the gods in our lineup at some point in your life. But this is one you'll grapple with every single day — multiple times per day.

Recognizing the god of Me

There are some symptoms that start to show up when the god of me edges himself onto the throne of my heart.

One symptom is arrogance. I'm always right. My way is the best way. The god of me won't listen to the wisdom of others.

This last Christmas we had opened presents at my in-laws' house. I was putting together one of the kids' toys on the family room floor and my father-in-law was sitting in his recliner watching the hunting channel — the channel that sends the message, "My son-in-law will never be a real man because he doesn't shoot things or build things."

I don't know if he was more amused by the TV show or by the sight of me trying to put something together. I could feel the pressure mounting as I tried desperately to screw in a screw. It wouldn't catch the threading. My father-in-law said, "I think that's a reverse screw." I took that to mean that it screws in the other way. I was sure he was making this up in an attempt to further expose my wimpiness in front of my other male relatives. I was not going to be fooled. I knew the saying "righty tighty, lefty loosey." It's not "righty loosey, lefty tighty." I kept turning this screw to the right, certain that there was no such thing as a reverse screw and too proud to take the advice of my father-in-law. (My editor says I need to finish this story. Whatever. I don't have to if I don't want to.)

So let me ask you this. When was the last time you made one of the following statements: "I was wrong"; "You were right"; "I should have listened to you"; "I like your idea better"? Even when we don't realize it, a touch of arrogance may be present.

Another symptom that surfaces when I start to worship the god of me is insecurity. The god of me is consumed with what others think and terrified of trying something and failing. You can't help but be self-conscious, because when you're god, it's all about you.

How about defensiveness? Have you ever found yourself taking the slightest suggestion, the blandest criticism, as a personal attack? What makes people this way? Well, when you're god, you must be perfect, and no one else could possibly be in a position to criticize you. The god of me will make you

lonely, because you can't handle equals. You certainly can't handle authority. You need people who constantly reaffirm that it's all about you.

Listen to what God says: "In the pride of your heart you say, 'I am a god; I sit on the throne of a god' ... But you are a mere mortal and not a god, though you think you are as wise as a god" (Ezekiel 28:2). The god of me is the most relentless idol of them all.

Gods at war? It's really me versus God. It's the flesh versus the spirit. All the other gods, in one way or another, take God off the throne and put me in his place.

It's an inescapable conclusion: worshiping the god of me is not in my best interests. The god of me takes many forms, but none of them satisfy. There is an image that is used in Scripture that captures what happens when I put myself on the throne of my heart instead of God.

In the Old Testament book of Jeremiah God speaks through the prophet Jeremiah and makes his case against his people. " 'Therefore I bring charges against you again,' declares the Lord. . . . 'My people have exchanged their glorious God for worthless idols. Be appalled at this, you heavens, and shudder with great horror,' declares the Lord. 'My people have committed two sins: They have forsaken me, the spring of living water, and have dug their own cisterns, broken cisterns that cannot hold water' " (Jeremiah 2:9, Jeremiah 2:11-13).

He summarizes their rebellion into two sins: they have rejected him and have instead turned to worthless idols. He explains to the people that when we put ourselves on the throne instead of God, it's like insisting on digging our own broken cisterns to drink out of when there is a spring of fresh, living water flowing right beside us.

Cisterns were an important part of everyday life in Israel during Jeremiah's time. In fact, thousands of them have been uncovered by archaeologists. Rain was infrequent and scarce about half the year, so the people in those days would dig their cisterns and then line them with bricks and plaster to hold the water. But cisterns were always breaking and losing water. Even when they didn't break, the water would often become stagnant or the supply would be inadequate.

The people would have thought of Jeremiah's metaphor as ridiculous. No one would ever choose a cistern as their water source when a spring of crystal clear water was available. But that captures the ridiculousness of idolatry. We choose a broken well with stagnant water, instead of the spring of fresh water.

We look to something or someone to do for us what God was meant to do for us.

Instead of looking to God as a source of comfort, we turn to food or mindless entertainment.

Instead of looking to God as our source of significance, we turn to our careers and our accomplishments.

Instead of looking to God as a source of security, we look to money and our investments.

Instead of looking to God as our source of joy, we look to our spouse and children.

Instead of looking to God as our source of hope, we look to politicians and legislation.

Instead of looking to God as our source of truth, we look to popular opinion and academic consensus.

Those things we look to for help aren't necessarily bad or evil in and of themselves. In fact God may use them to accomplish his purpose, but the question is, Have they become broken cisterns that we turn to instead of the living water? Am I putting my hope in something that doesn't hold water?

See then that you walk circumspectly, . . . redeeming the time, because the days are evil

— Ephesians 5: 15-16

GOD IS LOVE by Scott R. Bayles

There's an old song that says, "Love is many-splendored thing." The very concept of love is one of the most permeating themes in the world today. The Beatles sang about in the sixties. Their message to a hurt and frightened world was, "love is all you need." According to Amazon.com, there are at least 32,507 books currently in print with the word "love" in the title (over 145,000 that deal with the subject of love) and over 11,000 popular albums/CDs with "love" in the title. If you were to do a google-search on the internet, you'd discover at least 121,000,000 web-sites that use the word "love" as one of their key words. It's deniable, how important love is to our culture—to any culture really.



But with all this information available, love has become a very confusing subject. When I watch TV, check the internet, or scan magazines in the checkout lines, it's clear that our society has a very poor understanding of love. Not long ago, I heard about a single mother with two school age children. This mother had a busy social life—too busy, in fact. When the children got in the way of her fun, she loaded them up with cough medicine. With the kids drugged to sleep, she and the boyfriend of the day were free to do whatever they wanted. Now, I venture to say that if the authorities were to intervene to rescue those children, that woman would protest, "I love my children!" But is that really love? With humanity so confused about love, who is to say what love is?

The answer is—God! One of the simplest and yet most profound definitions of love is found in 1 John 4:8. John, who by the way was known as the apostle of love, wrote, "God is love." Those three little words ought to fill our hearts with warmth and hope. If those words are true, it makes all the difference in the world! But we need to understand this rightly. "God is love" does not mean that "love is God." In other words, love does not define God; rather, God defines love. Much of what we call "love" in modern America bears no resemblance or relationship to the holy, spiritual love of God. So it is important that we dig a little deeper into this passage to discover what God's love really is. In this chapter, John indicates four characteristics of God's love for you and me, the first of which is that God's love is a personal love.

• A PERSONAL LOVE

John begins this section of Scripture by saying, "Dear friends, let us continue to love one another, for love comes from God. Anyone who loves is a child of God and knows God. But anyone who does not love does not know God, for God is love" (1 John 4:7-8 NLT).

I think the overriding impression of these two verses is that the love of God is personal. God's love causes us to know Him, and Him to know us. I think that A.W. Tozer said it best: "The love of God is one of the great realities of the universe, a pillar upon which the hope of the world rests. But it is a personal, intimate thing too. God does not love populations, He loves people. He loves not masses, but men."

Wishing you and those you love a very joyous celebration of renewed faith, hope and joy. Have a very blessed Easter.
